ABOUT INTERKULTUR



... Connecting bridges.

30 years of success: Since 1988 INTERKULTUR, founded by Günter Titsch, is the world's leading organiser of international choir competitions and festivals. The event series has meanwhile become known throughout the world for its high artistic and organisational standards. INTER-KULTUR is a concept for choirs all over the world and their excitement about its competitions and festivals is constantly growing.

Since more than 30 years singers and choirs from all over the world have been celebrating international choral music with INTERKULTUR in different cities and on different continents. Whether the Palau de la Música in Barcelona or the Brucknerhaus Linz, whether dream destinations in South Africa or Vietnam; wherever they go, participants will experience a peaceful, world-spanning festival of singing and intercultural choral music on a high artistic level. Friendship Concerts and joint singing events complete the great emotional impact of INTERKULTUR's international choral meetings.

INTERKULTUR unites nations. In 2004 and 2006 – following long negotiations – the organisation was able to bring choirs from North and South Korea together on stage. Also choirs from countries like Israel and Iran keep coming together at the choir festivals and light a beacon of peace in Friendship Concerts.

Participation is the highest honour. INTERKULTUR's biggest success to date was to bring the antique Olympic idea to the choral community. The Choir Olympics 2000 in Linz, Austria was the beginning of a Choir Olympic movement, which goes around the world until today: Its story of success continues with subsequent events in Busan, Republic of Korea in 2002 and Bremen, Germany in 2004, and as of 2006 under the name "World Choir Games" in Xiamen, China; Graz, Austria in 2008; Shaoxing, China in 2010; Cincinnati, USA in 2012; Riga, Latvia in 2014 and the Winter Olympics City of Sochi, Russia in 2016. The 10th anniversary edition of the World Choir Games in 2018 happened on African soil for the first time: Tshwane in South Africa attracted over 300 choirs and more than 16,000 participants in July 2018. Due to the worldwide COVID-19 pandemic the 11th edition of the World Choir Games hosted by the cities of Antwerp and Ghent in Belgium had to be postponed from July 2020 to the fall 2021. For the first time in the event's history these Games took place as a hybrid event with live competitions in Flanders and an additional Virtual Competitions part.

The 12th and 13th World Choir Games are inviting choirs from around the world to Gangneung, Republic of Korea in summer 2023 and to Auckland, New Zealand in July 2024.

Since 2007 INTERKULTUR has been transferring the idea of the World Choir Games also to different continents: The **Asia Pacific Choir Games** took place for the 4th time already in October 2017. Host city was the Sri Lankan capital Colombo. In 2013 the **European Choir Games** premi-

ered in Graz, Austria. Subsequent editions of the event were held in Magdeburg, Germany (2015) and in the Latvian capital Riga (2017), along with the **Grand Prix of Nations**, which addresses international top choirs. In August 2019 choirs from all over the world met in Gothenburg (Sweden) for the 4th edition of the Grand Prix of Nations & European Choir Games. The next editions of the European Choir Games will happen in Norrköping, Sweden in the fall of 2023 and in Aarhus, Denmark in 2025.

The Idea

INTERKULTUR has become the symbol for a unique artistic idea: In comparison to traditional meritorious choir competitions that only invite international elite choirs to take part, the INTER-KULTUR competitions are open to all non-professional choirs. Choirs from all over the world, interested in gaining international festival and competition experience, can compete according to their level of artistic achievement. INTERKULTUR has opened a door to new impulses and perspectives for the national and international choral movement.

The Competitions

There are various categories for all types and levels of choirs in different degrees of difficulty, with or without compulsory pieces. The competitions offer good, competitive conditions, valuable, artistic contacts, various workshops and seminars, as well as practice opportunities with international performers. More than 200 experts and leading choirmasters from all over the world guarantee a high level of expertise in all INTERKULTUR events.

Evaluation System

The jury awards Bronze, Silver, and Gold Diplomas on 10 levels at INTERKULTUR competitions according to the MUSICA MUNDI[®] evaluation system (30-points-system); and Bronze, Silver and Gold Medals at the World Choir Games, the Asia Pacific Choir Games, the European Choir Games and the Grand Prix of Nations according to the World Choir Games evaluation system (100-points-system). In each category, a Winner or Champion is determined and outstanding achievements are honoured with Special Prizes. In some competitions there is a Grand Prize Competition of the best choirs selected by the international jury which determines the overall winner of the competition.

The Pedagogical Concept

INTERKULTUR events are not only competitions and international choir festivals, but also serve as professional development such as providing feedback from various pedagogical offerings. In Evaluation Performances or Individual Coachings, choirs have the chance to work with international jury members and gain advice on their current level of achievement, receive proficient pedagogical and artistic information and obtain suggestions as to how to interpret the chosen piece. The MUSICA MUNDI[®] Choir Academy gives new impetus especially to young choir conductors in China.



Every two years the World Choir Council consisting of currently 146 members representing 96 countries and regions comes together during the World Choir Games to discuss the choral scenes in their respective home countries. These meetings make an important contribution to the development of the international choral scene.

Locations of Festivals and Competitions

To date, INTERKULTUR events have taken place in Austria, Belgium, Czech Republic, Croatia, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Indonesia, Israel, Italy, Japan, Latvia, Malaysia, Malta, Netherlands, People's Republic of China, South Africa, Portugal, Philippines, Republic of Korea, Russia, Serbia, Spain, Sri Lanka, Sweden, Thailand, USA and Vietnam. Many cities have been convinced of the success of INTERKULTUR events and establish regular choir festivals or apply repeatedly to host more unifying major events.

The Participants

In total, roughly 10,600 choirs with more than 450,000 active singers from 109 countries have taken part in the INTERKULTUR competitions to date. An interesting note is that more than half of the participants have been children and youth up to 27 years of age and 67% of the participating choirs are returning ensembles looking forward to new destinations and new choral challenges. Many of them constantly increase their achievements – from first little successes to a Gold Medal or the sought-after Champions title.

Means of Support

In accordance with its statutes, INTERKULTUR supports the following activities:

- International music festivals and choir competitions whose goal is to bring together choirs from different regions of the world and encourage international collaboration through mutual respect, as well as to contribute to cultural exchange and understanding among nations
- Children and youth choirs even from financially challenged countries
- Non-professional choirs that focus on the growth of youth development
- Young, talented choirmasters, young musicians and singers through the support of scholarship awards
- Specific sponsorship opportunities

ARTISTIC DIRECTORS & JURY

Netherlands

Johan Rooze

Artistic Director



Johan Rooze studied Classic Piano and Choral and Orchestral Conducting at the Utrecht Conservatory of Music in the Netherlands. After his graduation, he went to the U.S. to study with Phil Mattson, Michelle Weir and others to specialise in Jazz Piano, Jazz Singing and Jazz Arranging.

He was founder and 23 years Musical Director of the Utrecht University Vocal Group "Dekoor" with whom he won many prices, e.g. The Netherlands Choir Festival, The International Vocal Group Festival and the "Idols for choir" TV show, "Korenslag" 2007 in the Netherlands, winning a record contract with Universal Music.

He was Musical Director of the Utrecht Student Symphonic Choir and Orchestra. With the two student choirs he made concert-tours all over the world. For his musical work at the University of Music he received in 2008 the honorary "Zilveren Penning" (Silver Medal).

He founded the "Dudok-Ensemble" an outstanding Project Choir and Orchestra, worked many years as Church Musician, was musical director of the monthly Bach Cantatas in Utrecht and guest conductor of the National Radio Choir.

For many years he taught Vocal Jazz Ensemble, Choral Conducting and Arranging at the Conservatory of Rotterdam and the Conservatory of Alkmaar in the Netherlands. He was member of the Board of Musical Advisors for the KCZB (Dutch Royal Christian Music Association) and Artistic Director for the IKF (International Choir Festival, Netherlands 2005).

In 2008 he moved to Daegu, South Korea, and taught Music at Keimyung University, Dutch Language at Hanguk University of Foreign Studies (HUFS) in Seoul and Choir and Jazz Piano at the Yeongnam University in Daegu. He is founder and Musical Director of the Daegu Jazz Singers. He conducts the Daegu Chamber Choir and since 2021 he is the main conductor of the Beomeo Cathedral in Daegu.

Since 2012 he is Artistic Director for the international choral organisation INTERKULTUR Besides his choral work he is very active as a Jazz Piano player and teacher and is often asked as adjudicator, guest-conductor, speaker and workshop/seminar-leader internationally.

Great Britain

Mathew Wright

Artistic Director & Jury




Mat has worked in the education sector for over 20 years working in schools in a variety of roles, most recently as a Regional Director of Education for a trust overseeing 27 schools across England. He has worked as an Advisory Teacher and as an Advanced Skilled Teacher, delivering support and training nationally at Primary, Secondary, FE and HE levels, and has provided resources for government publications. He is the founder and Artistic Director of Barnsley Youth Choir, and founder of Barnsley Singers (an adult community choir) and has developed the choir into an internationally award-winning and recognised organisation.

As a member of the international jury, Mat has worked in some of the most important competitions in the world including the World Choir Games. He works closely with exceptional organisations including the Kodaly School (Hungary), The Adolf Fredriks Music School (Sweden) and the University of Pretoria (South Africa), all of whom have travelled to Barnsley to work with BYC and is in demand as a choral clinician and workshop leader throughout the world.

In 2019 Mat was appointed as a representative for Great Britain on the World Choir Council and in January 2020 was appointed a Member of the Order of the British Empire (MBE) for his services to young people by the Queen. In 2022 he was also made a Freeman of Barnsley in recognition for his work in the community.

Michael Dawson

Jury



Michael regularly adjudicates choral competitions around the world and in 2022 delivered masterclasses and choral clinics to over 45 different ensembles. As a singer Michael spent several years performing with the internationally acclaimed ensemble Anúna and recorded on several albums which include the soundtracks for Diablo III and World of Warcraft. He also holds a masters degree in Ritual, Chant and Song from the Irish World Academy of Music & Dance, University of Limerick and can be heard singing chant on the TV series Vikings.

Currently Michael is expanding the Irish Institute of Music & Song, a non-profit organisation dedicated to expanding music education in Ireland and sharing Irish culture globally. His specialty areas include conducting, science informed voice pedagogy, choral music, and music education. Michael is also a keen Irish traditional musician and plays the uilleann pipes, bagpipes and low whistle in his spare time!





Great Britain/Wales

Paul Mealor

Jury



Born in St Asaph, North Wales in 1975, Paul Mealor studied composition privately as a boy with William Mathias and later with John Pickard, and at the University of York with Nicola LeFanu and in Copenhagen with Hans Abrahamsen and Per Nørgård. Since January 2003 he has taught in the Music Department at the University of Aberdeen where he is Professor of Composition.

Mealor is the first President of $T\hat{y}$ Cerdd and Patron of the Welsh Music Guild. He is Vice-President of the Llangollen International Eisteddfod and the North Wales International Music Festival and was the Curator of JAM on the Marsh in Kent (2015-17) and Composer in Residence with Canada's top professional choir, Pro Coro Canada.

Mealor was catapulted to international stardom in April 2011, when 2.5 billion people heard his Motet, Ubi caritas performed by the choirs of Westminster Abbey and Her Majesty's Chapel Royal at the Royal Wedding Ceremony of His Royal Highness Prince William and Catherine at Westminster Abbey.

He has received many awards and honours for his music including the Glanville Jones Award, from the Welsh Music Guild, for his outstanding contribution to music in Wales (2013). In January 2018, HM Queen Elizabeth II appointed him an Officer of the Venerable Order of St John and in November 2020, The Saltire Society of Scotland presented him with The Fletcher of Saltoun Award for outstanding contribution to the arts and humanities in Scotland, becoming only the second composer, after Sir James MacMillan, to be given this award.

Paul Mealor is one of the world's most 'performed' living composers and has been described as, 'the most important composer to have emerged in Welsh choral music since William Mathias' (New York Times, 2001).

Norway

Tove Ramlo-Ystad



Tove Ramlo-Ystad is an educated singer and conductor and holds a Master's degree from the Norwegian University of Science and Technology in Trondheim.

Her teachers and mentors in conducting have been Stefan Sköld, Anders Eby and Mogens Dahl.

Tove Ramlo-Ystad is one of Norway's most recognised choral conductors. She is a very popular and inspiring guest conductor and is frequently used as a juror at international choral competitions.

Tove Ramlo-Ystad has conducted the female choir Cantus since their beginning in 1986. Cantus has received much attention, won several competitions and is known for its Nordic sound. This sound was the reason Disney discovered Cantus, and led to the choir being chosen for the animated film 'Frozen'.

Previously, she directed both mixed and male ensembles.

Tove Ramlo-Ystad is the Musical Director of the Norwegian Choral Association and the Artistic Director of The Norwegian Choir Competiton.



Slovenia

Karmina Šilec



Karmina Šilec is the Artistic Director of Carmina Slovenica, Ensemble !Kebataola! and Choregie – New Music Theatre. She is a conductor, composer, director and author. With her unique concept choregie she brought freshness and originality to the world of vocal music and theatre, has opened wider artistic spaces and set trends worldwide.

As conductor and director she has projects with various companies, opera houses and ensembles. Karmina's productions have been performed worldwide on stages and festivals of the highest esteem.

Karmina Šilec has received more than 20 highest international awards at choir competitions and the International Robert Edler Prize for Choral Music for her exceptional contribution to the world choir movement. She also works as an artistic adviser for choral music, university professor for conducting, a guest conductor and jury member at festivals and competitions.

Sanna Valvanne

Jury



Sanna Valvanne, director of the Sing & Shine Choirs, is one of the most international and innovative Finnish choir conductors. She is recognised world wide for her creative and expressive choral method "Sing & Shine with Body & Soul". A former singer and vocal trainer of the world famous Tapiola Choir, Sanna created the method in 1994, while studying for her Master's Degree in Music at the Sibelius Academy. She has since been a popular guest conductor with hundreds of choirs and festivals around the world.

For 11 years in the USA, she developed her choral work further to support social causes and uplift humanity, finally launching her own organisation in Espoo, Finland in 2016. By now her Sing & Shine Choirs have empowered hundreds of people from all ages in training, performances and community projects. Whether with her own choirs or guest conducting, Sanna continues to expand the boundaries of choral expression, and explore new ways of sharing love and joy through singing.




Hull Minster




Bringing a big Hull welcome, the Opening Ceremony will feature performances by children from a range of Hull primary schools. These children are participating in the choral strategy of Hull Music Education Hub. They will be singing a selection of British Isles songs from the past 500 years.

In addition, a massed choir will bring together singers from various adult choirs in Hull, (non-competing choirs) with members of Hull Youth Choir and Hull Visual Voices, conducted by Shelley Gabriel (Hull Music Service) and accompanied by Ben Newton. Using the concept of sailing and the power of the wind, symbolising Freedom, Sustainability and our maritime heritage, the trophies embody a fleet of boats, made from beech wood. The beech wood represents the beaches of the Humber and the fleet represents the teams of choirs journeying to our shores to attend the competition. They travel united together, yet each is unique and individual, just like the choirs and their members. Each of the sails has a different abstract design using the International signal flags for inspiration.
