STRENGTHENING THE CHORAL CULTURE - CHOIRS ON TV

A brand new international TV competition was launched on July 22, 2017.

"Eurovision Choir of the Year 2017" featured Europe's best amateur choirs who traveled to Riga, Latvia, to compete for the title "Eurovision Choir of the Year". The choir "Carmen Manet" from Slovenia won this first inaugural competition.

"Eurovision Choir of the Year 2017" was a co-production between the European Broadcasting Union (EBU) and member Latvian Television (LTV). It took place within the popular international competition European Choir Games, organized by INTERKULTUR, in collaboration with LIVE RIGA.

The second edition of Eurovision Choir was hosted on Saturday August 3, 2019 at the Partille Arena in Gothenburg, Sweden.

10 of Europe's best amateur choirs were eager to impress a panel of international choral music stars by performing an unaccompanied selection of music in a variety of styles. The choir "Vocal Line" from Denmark won the second edition of this event.

The show was hosted by Petroc Trelawny from BBC and Ella Petterson from SVT and adjudicated by Sweden's Katarina Henryson, a founding member of pioneering a cappella ensemble The Real Group, British composer and conductor John Rutter and US producer and arranger Deke Sharon.

The winning choir of Eurovision Choir 2019 got not only a trophy and the title "Eurovision Choir 2019". INTERKULTUR offered also an all-inclusive trip to the World Choir Games 2021, taking place from October 30 - November 7, 2021 in Flanders, Belgium.

The MUSICA MUNDI® label is a brand of INTERKULTUR and stands for the quality of all INTERKULTUR events, a smooth course of events and utmost convenience for all participants.

Long lasting experience

Since the first choral competition in 1988 the evaluation system for choral performances and the event schedule itself have been improved continuously. Experiences of international jurors and advisors as well as the feedback of our participants were implemented into this process. The event concept has been adjusted so that joy of the international encounter of cultures as well as quality, fair play and pedagogical standards always come first at the INTERKULTUR events.

Alternatively the non-competitive participation in the international choral festival offers joint concerts with singers from around the globe – and this is also part of MUSICA MUNDI®.

Open access

INTERKULTUR events are always international events and ensure a range of manifold possibilities for get-togethers and cultural exchanges. The huge interest of children, youth and young adults is also taken into consideration in our portfolio. Likewise we pay attention to the different levels of artistic achievements. Thus our competitions are not only attractive for top choirs but also especially for those groups who have only few or no experience in competitions.





Fair and transparent evaluation

Due to the growing number of participating choirs, events and categories INTERKULTUR initiated a new system for the assessment of all choirs' performances - the MUSICA MUNDI® evaluation system. Since the first choir competition in 1988, the evaluation system for the choirs' performances and the event itself have been continuously enhanced.

The experience of the international jurors and advisors as well as the suggestions of the participants have contributed to this. The event and evaluation concept have been refined in such a way that, in addition to the joy of the international meeting of cultures, the quality, fairness and transparency of INTERKULTUR choir competitions are in focus.

At the smaller INTERKULTUR competitions the jury awards Golden, Silver and Bronze Diplomas within 10 levels according to the MUSICA MUNDI® counsellors evaluation system (30-point system) as well as Bronze, Silver or Golden Medals at the World Choir Games, the World Choir Championships and the Grand Prix of Nations according to the evaluation system of the World Choir Games (100-point system). There is a Winner or Champion in each category, and outstanding performances are honored with Special Prizes. In some competitions there is also singing for the overall victory of the event, the so-called Grand Prize.

Learning from experts

Pedagogical offers which provide further possibilities to participate in the festival and share the experience for non-competing choirs are inherent parts of the World Choir Events. The MUSICA MUNDI® Academy unites the educational activities of INTERKULTUR within the INTERKULTUR Foundation. It serves the professional further education of the entire choral community and offers advanced training opportunities within the context of INTERKULTUR events, e.g. seminars for choral conductors. These include lectures, workshops and master classes and are open to all choir conductors and choral music fans, regardless of their professional background and level.

The promotion of choral singing on an international level is one of the central concerns of INTERKULTUR. Pedagogical events took place, among others, in China, Germany, USA, Russia, Latvia, Austria, South Africa, Indonesia, Italy, United Arab Emirates, Israel, Sweden, Italy, Czech Republic, Portugal ... so far.



INTERKULTUR WORLD RANKINGS

All INTERKULTUR competitions have been carried out according to the MUSICA MUNDI® quality seal. This allows an impressive overall comparison of all choirs that have participated.

The INTERKULTUR World Rankings are applicable retroactively to the year 2000. Based upon this World Rankings, individual lists are then made which reflect the situation in the various categories.

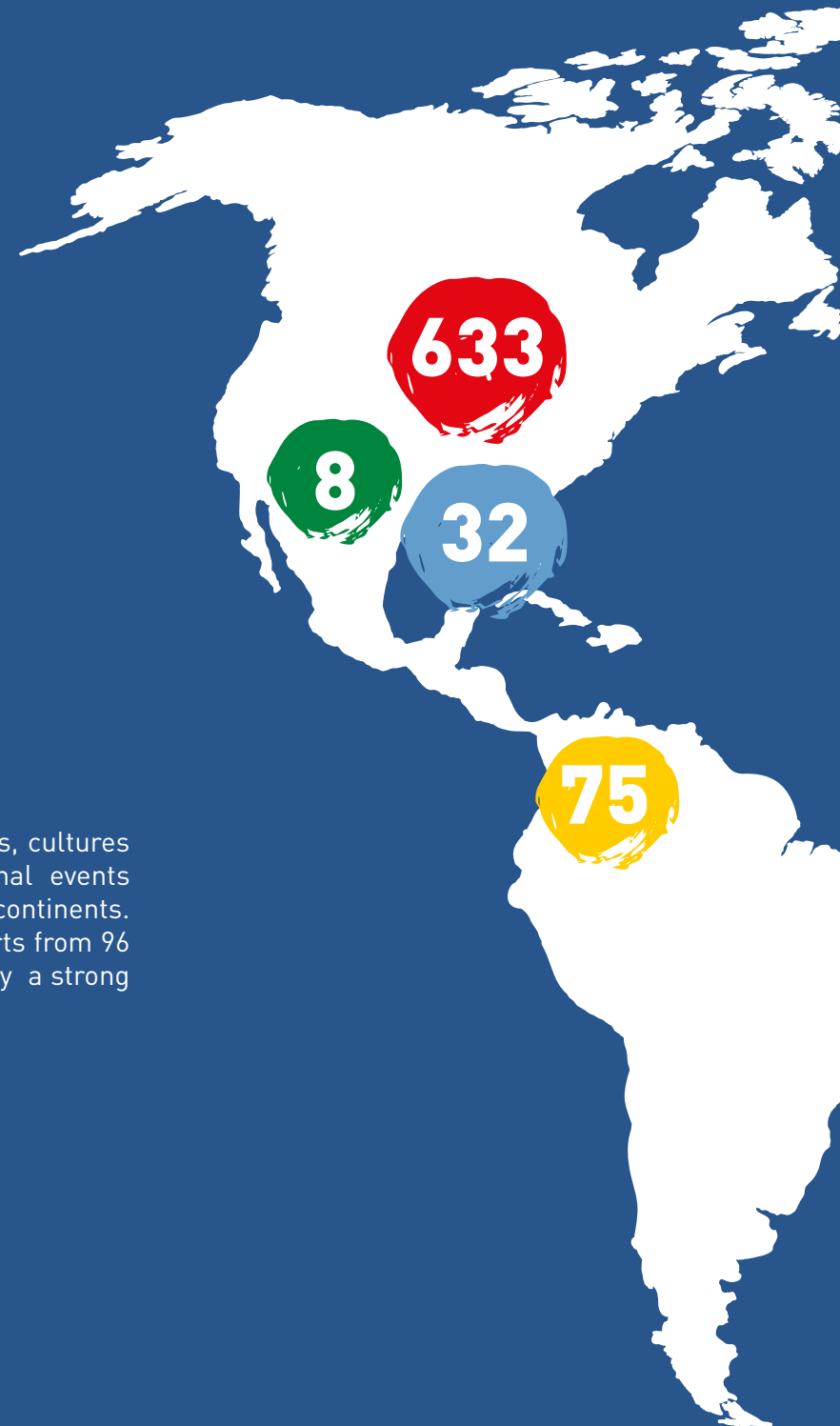

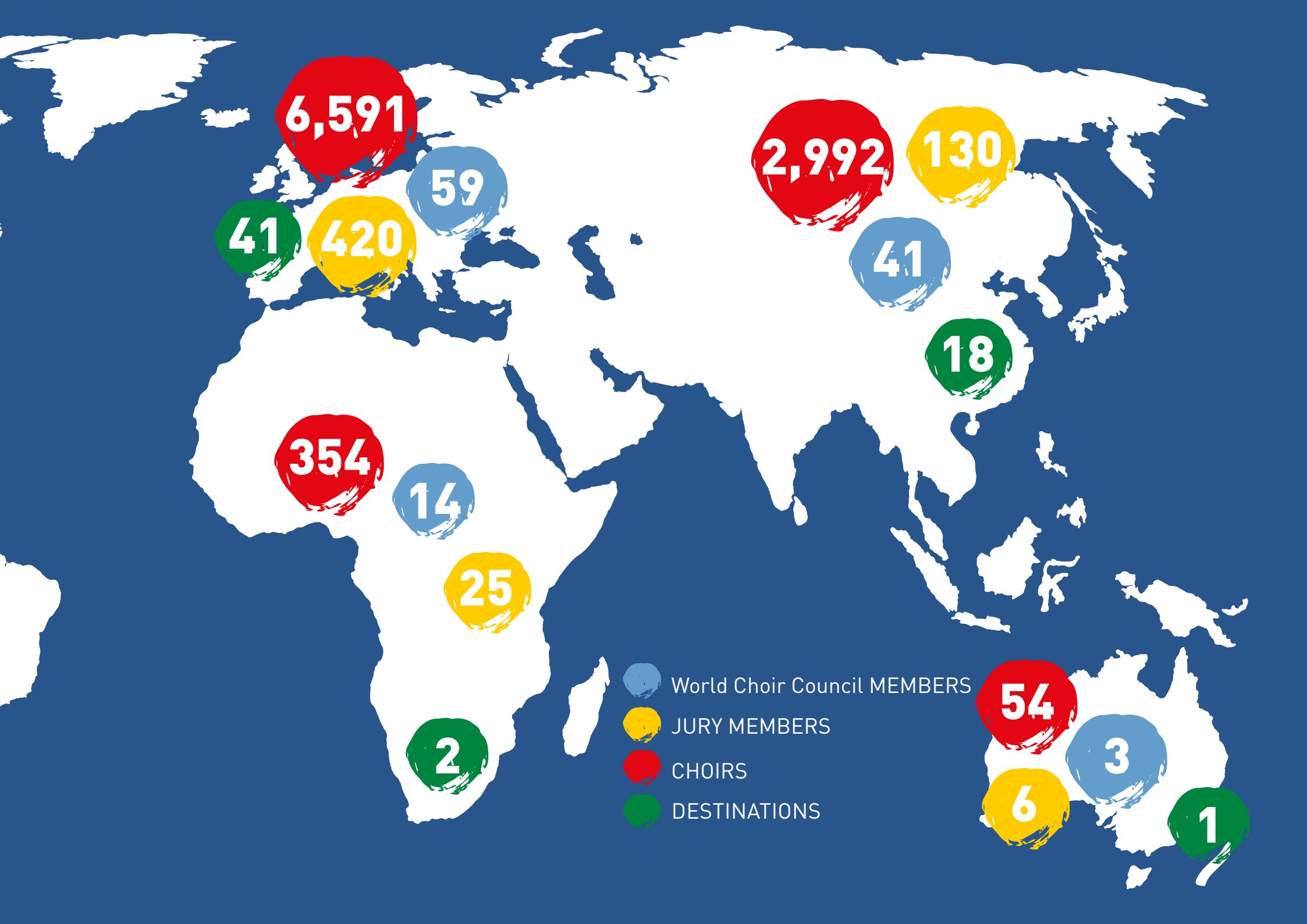

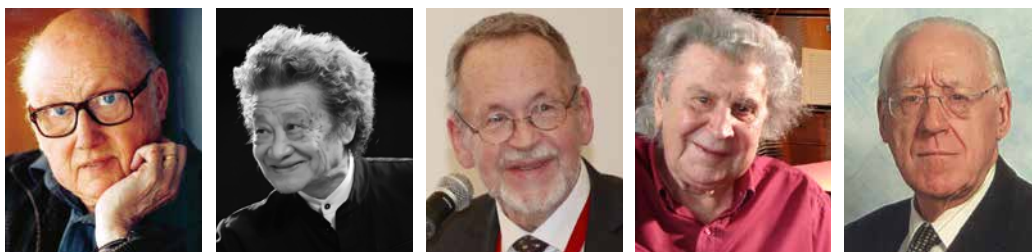

The World Choir Council is not only a well-known and very important part of the choral world, but also a very important member of the INTERKULTUR family. It is INTERKULTUR's highest and voluntary international advisory body. It currently consists of over almost 150 international members representing more than 95 regions and nations in this circle.

Highly respected representatives from around the world join forces to empower choral singing

In its more than 20 years of activity, the World Choir Council has had a major impact on the development of the INTERKULTUR World Choir Events and the growth and strengthening of the international choral world. Under the motto “Singing together brings nations together” they support INTERKULTUR with their valuable experience in the artistic and organizational areas and are dedicated to actively promoting the development of the choral scene in their region and internationally.

The representatives meet regularly, report on the choral scene in their respective country and discuss jointly urgent matters and current topics in the choral world. The members also act as spokesperson for their country's choral community, as well as important multipliers and communicators in their local area.

WORLD CHOIR PEACE PRIZE

The World Choir Peace Prize is given to a person or organization which has made an outstanding contribution to the world peace through choral music. Singing promotes peace, understanding and good will and builds bridges, which overcome political, racial, social and religious differences. The prize is awarded by INTERKULTUR in order to show examples of how choral music can influence love and peace in our world in a positive way.

The Prize was bestowed for the first time during the World Choir Games in Riga 2014. The three Baltic States Latvia, Estonia and Lithuania received the World Choir Peace Prize for their rich choral singing traditions, especially manifested in the long series of great Song Festivals, which have also been acknowledged by the UNESCO.

WORLD CHOIR (CAPITAL) CITY

The **World Choir Capital City** award is given by INTERKULTUR and the World Choir Council to a city which features a vibrant choral life and a big number of choirs performing on an international level. Furthermore, the city is supposed to support choral activities for children and youth above the ordinary, and have a pedagogical concept regarding the advancement of choral music. In addition, the city should be internationally focused, which is reflected in the willingness to organize international events. Guangzhou/China (2012), Graz/Austria (2013) and Riga/Latvia (2017) are the laureates of this award so far.

CHOIR DEVELOPMENT FUND (CDF)

The **Choir Development Fund** was founded by INTERKULTUR in order to particularly support children's and youth choirs from financially weak countries and to enable them to participate in international cultural exchange through donations, contributions and proceeds from benefit events in accordance with the statutes of the INTERKULTUR Association. These financial contributions are used, for example, to obtain sheet music for young singers for a choir competition, to pay the costs of accommodation during a choir event, to take advantage of professional coaching before a competition performance and much more. This support enables young singers to participate in an international, unique and life-changing choral event such as the World Choir Games!

Musically underprivileged singers from children's and youth choirs, e.g. with a low-income background, from war-torn nations or suffering from a disability, receive support from the Choir Development Fund and a real chance to become part of the worldwide choral community and be impacted by this unique experience. But not only singers are supposed to benefit from the choir support - young conductors are also explicitly included in the Development Fund, which aims to promote peaceful coexistence between different nations and religions with the help of choral singing.
